

May WIL Honoree Jessica Bauer Walker Executive Director, Community Health Worker Network of Buffalo

The Community Health Worker Network of Buffalo offers empowerment and asset-building strategies for individuals and communities, developed and delivered by a diverse collaboration

of community health workers, community members, advocates and other stakeholder groups.

Community Health Workers (CHWs) are frontline workers who address health in a holistic context, and are of or from the communities they serve. They are a vital workforce and use methodology to improve community self-sufficiency, foster meaningful use of health and social service systems, and improve health and well-being in neighborhoods with complex needs.

Jessica, a Buffalo native who was first bit by the CHW bug while doing Peace Corps work in Jamaica, came back to the city three-anda-half years ago, and directed an HIV/AIDs organization until taking on her current role with the CHW Network last year.

Jessica was a Peace Corps volunteer in Jamaica where she did community health work; it's very different there in terms of how health is handled. There isn't a huge healthcare infrastructure, so there is a lot of community-based care, and community health workers, specifically, and they are filling a gap and a need where medical professionals can't necessarily be – whether in urban centers or in rural areas – which provides them with access to programs and services.

She was also an Americorps volunteer and has a background in concepts and community organizing, and has worked in Washington, D.C. at critical organizations and on political campaigns as well. These lessons in global health can be applied in communities that are struggling with health disparities, like urban Buffalo. The Community Health Worker Network of Buffalo is trying to promote different organizations that are coming together in order to improve our community, and promote a broader view of health. Whether it's an education organization or a domestic violence organization, whether it's East Side or West Side, they're all really working to lift up the community with a goal to bring all of that positive energy and effort together.

Jessica says, "Our biggest challenge is shifting the power from institutions to programs and services and allowing community members to really come up with solutions that make sense for them, and to really have a community-based, bottom-up, grassroots process."
