Paula Lynn D'Amico, president of NAWBO Buffalo Niagara, was on vacation in March on International Women's Day.

Instead of thinking about relaxing and recharging, she was thinking of her chapter's members again and decided to pick up the phone and call every single one.

"There's been discussions on calls with chapter presidents to do a phone tree and have board members reach out to members," Paula explains. "We started this over the summer to check in with our NAWBO sisters."

Still, so much has happened for every woman business owner over this past year that Paula felt she wanted to personally reach out to see how each member is doing and maneuvering her way through the pandemic. Paula didn't think twice – she just opened her member list and started calling from top to bottom.

"The gift wasn't me so much calling them," Paula says, who spent two days making calls. "It was what they gave back to me. It's so important for leadership to reach out and call their NAWBO sisters and check in on them. They were all so grateful – it was an unexpected ray of sunshine."

In fact, Paula had never even met the first woman she called who shared that the year had been tough and she was considering packing up her business and moving out of state. "By the end of our conversation, she was so grateful," Paula recalls. "She had prayed for a sign or to get some sort of support and here was this call. She needed a little assistance too, so I was able to connect her with another NAWBO sister." Other members shared how they had taken second jobs to support their families during this time when business is down.

"I just wanted to be a sister and reach out to these women who have become my friends and some of us have done business together to give them this simple gift of support," Paula says. "I can't even describe what they gave me in return. We laughed, cried and had some real moments. It was so simple, yet so incredibly powerful."


In 2018, I found out about a small business grant through a fellow NAWBO member and was




